



UNIFORM POLICY

This policy has been developed and endorsed by the Glenwood High School community through the School Uniform Committee and the School Steering Committee. This policy was approved and adopted by the Committee in October 2004, and reviewed and updated June 2020.

BASIC PRINCIPLES

School uniform builds a sense of community and ownership amongst students. This instils pride in the school and its attainments as well as forming a lasting impression of the school in the wider community.

School uniform allows students to be easily identified by staff. Similarly, persons who are not part of the school are easily recognised ensuring a high level of security at all times.

School uniform, if worn correctly and consistently, builds student self-esteem, confidence and a sense of belonging.

School uniform is the most economical and sensible way to dress students for school.

OUR UNIFORM

The basic uniform is worn year round with additional items available for winter.

There are some differences between the junior uniform for Years 7 to 10 and the senior uniform for Years 11 to 12, though the basic colour scheme remains the same.

GIRLS YEARS 7-10

- Glenwood High deep blue over blouse with navy piping, buttons and school logo and peaked front panels
- School design skirt with pleats, mid-knee length or below in school navy tartan with red and royal blue.
- Alinta pinstripe slacks
- Plain white socks above the ankle and below the calves to be worn with the school skirt. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind. Black or navy socks to be worn under the school pinstriped pants.
- Navy tights or stockings
- The girls tab tie with school logo

GIRLS YEARS 11-12

- Glenwood High white over blouse with navy piping, buttons and school logo and peaked front panels
- School design skirt with pleats, mid-knee length or below in school navy tartan with red and royal blue.
- Alinta pinstripe slacks
- Plain white socks above the ankle and below the calves to be worn with the school skirt. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind. Black or navy socks to be worn under the school pinstriped pants.
- Navy tights or stockings
- The girls tab tie with school logo is optional but it is expected that students who are representing the school are wearing the school blazer and the school tie.
- Glenwood High School navy blazer with school logo.

BOYS YEARS 7-10

- Glenwood High blue over shirt with school logo
- Glenwood High charcoal college style shorts or trousers (trousers expected to be worn when students are representing the school)
- Black belt in traditional style
- Shorts must be to the knee with white above ankle socks. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind.
- School Trousers - Preferably, grey or black socks to be worn, however white socks will be acceptable during the transition period. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind.
- Striped boys tie with school logo.

BOYS YEARS 11-12

- Glenwood High white overshirt with school logo
- Glenwood High charcoal college style shorts or trousers (*trousers expected to be worn when students are representing the school*)
- Black belt in traditional style
- Shorts must be to the knee with white above ankle socks. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind.
- School Trousers - Preferably, grey or black socks to be worn, however white socks will be acceptable during the transition period. Socks must not have logos or colours of any kind.
- Striped boys tie with school logo is optional but it is expected that students who are representing the school are wearing the school blazer and the school tie.
- Glenwood High School navy blazer with school logo.

ALL STUDENTS

HAT

School navy blue cap with school name.

JUMPER

Glenwood High “Regatta” blue, V-neck machine washable woollen jumper with school logo.

JACKET

Glenwood High microfiber jacket or soft shell in navy with school logo.

UNDERSHIRT

Student may wear a white (senior) or light blue (junior) undershirt during colder months. This shirt is to be short sleeve and **not** visible under the school shirt.

SHOES

Hard black leather lace (please click on link for examples) up traditional style enclosed school shoes (with supportive heel) not the jogger or suede style.

PLEASE NOTE: Health and Safety rules require this style of shoe and these rules will be enforced.

SPORTS UNIFORM

- School sports shirt in royal blue & grey with red piping
- School sports shorts in charcoal grey
- Joggers or sport shoes
- White sports socks

PLEASE NOTE: Sports uniform must not be worn to school, but rather carried and changed into before sport or PE. Any student coming to school in sports uniform on a Wednesday will need to report to their Deputy Principal. Students may still receive a detention if a valid reason is not provided. For example, a wet uniform is not a valid reason.

VARIATIONS ON THE ABOVE UNIFORM ITEMS ARE UNACCEPTABLE WITHOUT EXCEPTION

Students will be excluded from certain school and school-linked activities:

- **If their clothing compromises agreed upon school community standards articulated in this policy statement, and might be considered damaging to the image of the school in the larger community context;**
- **Where the health and safety of the student or, of other students, particularly as defined by work health and safety legislation, would otherwise be compromised.**

In the event of an unavoidable situation where uniform cannot be worn, students must bring a signed note from their parent/carer, with their name and year group, explaining the issue with their uniform. This is to be given to the student's Connect (roll call) teacher. If it is anticipated that students will be out of uniform for more than one day, the note must be given to your Deputy Principal BEFORE school. Students with a note will be provided with a uniform pass. Failure to follow this procedure will lead to a recess detention. While a student won't be suspended solely for not wearing school uniform, ongoing non-compliance will be regarded as an infringement of the school's student discipline policy.

THE DRESS CODE

1. The school uniform must be worn in an appropriate fashion and not with individual variations, hair ties, winter scarves & religious headwear must be navy blue. The wearing of coloured singlets or t-shirts under the uniform is not acceptable. Any non-uniform apparel of any description must not be worn, including (but not limited to) hoodies, sloppy joes, beanies, non-uniform hats etc.
2. Students are expected to be neat, tidy and well-groomed at all times
3. Jewellery must be subtle silver or gold. Jewellery is only acceptable if inoffensive and of a safe design. For example, earrings **must** be studs or sleepers, **not long dangling styles as these are unsafe in a school environment.**
 - Chains or necklaces must be of a fine nature and worn inside the shirt or blouse.
 - Students will be asked to remove inappropriate jewellery. The Principal's decision is final.
4. Makeup should not be excessive or inappropriate. **No brightly coloured hair is permitted.** Nail polish must be of neutral colour.
5. Any offensive or inappropriate item worn to school may result in a student being removed from class and parents contacted. This includes items of clothing with messages, symbols, pictures or logos other than the school logo.
6. Students who are representing the school at non-sporting events are expected to wear the formal uniform - skirts only for girls, preferably with a blazer and ties.
